WITH DIGITAL HANDHELD MICROSCOPES

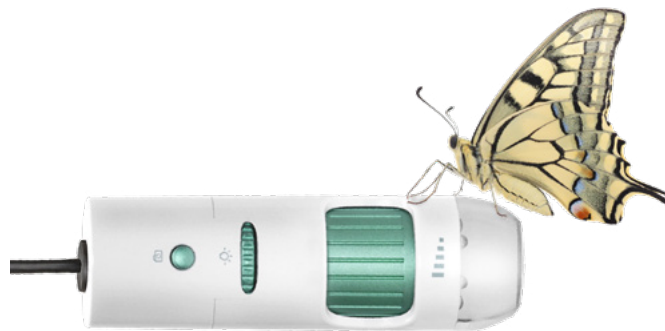
Our Magnification Magic resource will become one of your go to resources in and out of the classroom. Here's how it works.

Simply click on the specimen you want to see. It will open to that image magnified at 500x. If that is too much magnification for the age of the student or the lesson, keep scrolling down to the next page. You will see the specimen next magnified at 200x, followed by 100x, 50x, 30x, and 15x. The last page will show you a full image of the item.

Choose the magnification best suited for your needs.

Try playing Guess What It Is. Make sure to use powerful questions that promote higher order thinking skills like the following:

- "What does this remind you of?"
- "How do you think it might work?"
- "What do you notice?"
